KEY SURVEILLANCE PRIORITY DISEASE AND 117 CALL CENTRE HIGHLIGHTS FOR THE WEEK

Disease specific report Highlights


- Acute Flaccid Paralysis (AFP): Four (4) cases of AFP were reported this
 week. Of the cases, three were unser fives and one above five years of
 age. Tonkolili (3) and WAR (1) districts. The cases were investigated and
 sent to the CPHRL for confirmatory shipment.
- Cholera: One (1) case of suspected Cholera was reported in an under five year old from Bombali district. The case was investigated and sample sent to the CPHRL for confirmation. District putting modalities for RCCE interventions
- Measles: Fifteen (15) cases of suspected measles were reported this
 week. Of the cases, eight were under fives and seven over five years of
 age from Port Loko (13) and WAU (2) districts. The cases were investigated and samples sent to CPHRL for confirmation.
- Animal Bite (Dog): Thirty (30) Dog bite cases were reported this week.
 Of the cases, seven were under five years and twenty-three were above five years. The highest number of cases were from Kono (9), Bombali (7) and Kailahun (4) districts.
- Animal Bite (Snake): Four (4) Snake bite cases with one death death was reported this week. The death was from Port Loko district. Of the cases, one was under five and three above five years of age. The cases were from Port Loko, Bombali, Kailahua and Kambia (1) each per district.
- Maternal death: Thirteen (13) maternal deaths were reported from WAU (3), Port Loko and Kailahun (2) whiles Kailahun, Kenema, Falaba and Bonthe, Koinadugu and Bo (1) each per district.
- Yellow Fever: Three (3) suspected cases of Yellow Fever were reported
 this week. All of the cases were above five years of age and were from
 WAU (2) and Bonthe (1) districts. The cases were investigated and samples sent to CPHRL for confirmation
- Acute Viral Hemorrhagic Fever (AVHF): Seven (7) case of suspected
 AVHF and two deaths were reported this week. The dearhs were from
 Kenerma district. The cases comprised of five under fives and two above
 fives years. from Kenema (5) and Kailahun and WAR (1) each per district.
 The cases were investigated and samples sent to CPHRL for confirmation
 and all tested negative for AVHF.

117 Call Centre Highlights

- Pneumonia: Ten (10) calls related to Pneumonia were made this week countrywide. All of the cases were aged above five years. WAU (5), WAR (2) while Bombali, Koinadugu and Bo (1) each per district
- Perinatal Deaths: Nine (9) calls related to Perinatal deaths were made this week of which,
 stillbirth (6) and neonatal death (3)
- **Bloody Diarrhoea:** One (1) call related to bloody diarrhoea was made from Bo
- Measles: Three (3) calls related to Measles were made from Port Loko district this week.

117 Call Summary for epi week 1, 2024


- A total of 10,083 calls were received and responded to, out of which 9,965 (98.8%) were prank calls and 118 (1.2%) were signals
- Out of the total signals received:
 - Death 105 (89.0%)
 - Health Emergencies 7 (5.9%): dog bite
 2, snake bite 2 & requesting ambulatory Service 3
 - Sick 5 (4.2%)
 - Referral call 1 (0.8): Fire force



For week 2 of 2024, 15 out of 16 districts achieved both the WHO and national targets for timeliness and completeness while one failed to meet both targets

Updates from the samples of suspected cases reported for this week

- Acute Flaccid Paralysis (AFP): Four cases of AFP detected. Samples were collected and sent to CPHRL for confirmatory shipment. The TAT for AFP samples is between 2-3 weeks.
- Cholera: A suspected case of cholera from Bombali. Sample tested negative from CPHRL
- **Measles:** Only seven samples were received by the Laboratory for week two. Samples have been tested and results will be released on the 19th /01/2024.
- Yellow fever: Three suspected cases of Yellow fever reported this. All samples collected and sent to CPHRL for confirmation and results are still pending. The turn around time (TAT) for yellow fever samples in country is seven days
- Acute Viral Haemorrhagic Fever (AVHF): Seven cases of suspected AVHF were reported this week.
 The sample were collected and sent to Kenema regional & Jui P3 Lab, samples however tested Negative for Lassa EVD




For week two of 2024, a total of 110 call signals for sick and death were made of which 105 were related to deaths and five were for sick. The age groups of 36 –59 and above 60 had a higher proportion of death reported and the least was 6-25 years. No sick was reported for the age group of 36-59 years

For week two of 2024, a total of 1,546 facilities reported countrywide using various means of reporting. Mobile SMS and mobile internet were used exclusively by three districts (Kailahun, Kambia and Port Loko). Only one district (WAR) used paper based reporting of which, 16/77 (20%) of the facilities reported using paper. The country has moved from paper based reporting to electronic since 2018

117 Call signals by reporting Districts (N=118)



For week two of 2024, greater proportion of call signals were from Bo, closely followed by WAU and then WAR districts, 4/16 (25%) districts made zero call.


