Challenge: Siloed Structure Hinders Public Health Efforts

Sierra Leone's current public health infrastructure struggles to effectively coordinate disease surveillance, outbreak response, and public health programs. The scattered NPHA headquarters across outdated facilities create a fragmented structure that impedes collaboration, communication, and efficient resource allocation.

Solution: Building a Modern Hub for Public Health

The NPHA aims to establish a centralized headquarters to streamline operations and improve efficiency—a move that is critical for safeguarding public health and enhancing our shared goals. This 'one-stop shop' approach will consolidate various functions under one roof, enhancing coordination and response times during health crises. Our plan includes:

- **Establishment of a Dedicated Headquarters:** We plan to build a state-of-the-art headquarters in Freetown, specifically designed to meet the needs of a national public health agency. This facility will house:
 - **Centralized Command Center:** A dedicated space with advanced communication technology for real-time disease surveillance, outbreak response coordination, and information dissemination.
 - **Consolidated Departments:** Dedicated workspaces for all eight NPHA departments, fostering collaboration, communication, and knowledge-sharing across disciplines.
 - **Training and Conference Facilities:** Modernized training rooms and conference halls to host workshops, training programs, and conferences for public health professionals, strengthening national public health capacity.
 - **Advanced Data Management Systems:** Secure data storage and analysis infrastructure to effectively manage disease surveillance data, monitor trends, and inform public health decisions.
 - **Sustainable Maintenance Plan:** A dedicated budget allocated for the ongoing maintenance and upkeep of the headquarters.
